My name is Samantha Wallace and I am a single mum of 2 children and I live near the Cuerden Valley in Chorley. I work in the NHS full time and work with families and young people to try and make their lives healthier and happier. I have been lucky enough to gain a Charity place in the LONDON MARATHON in 2020. I turn 40 years old next year and wanted to do something that has been on my life list of amazing things to do whilst I still can! I have watched the London Marathon on television since I was a young girl and was always inspired by the sheer determination, pain and achievement on people's face as they were running the marathon. London is just an epic place and so iconic that I felt that I would push my personal boundaries and go for something I have never done before. I have never walked 26 miles, never mind run it! So this is a massive personal challenge for me but something that I feel can be inspirational for others too.

I have decided to run for this wonderful charity who works to create brighter futures for children and young adults. We are trying to raise money for a charity named The Shaw Trust (Charity No: 287785) which helps disadvantaged young people and adults with education and job support. I have previously worked in Blackburn with young offenders for the Council and for a childrens charity who aren't attending school to try and help them and their families with personal and financial issues. So the Shaw Trust is genuinely something which is really close to my heart as I know how difficult it can be for young people in really challenging circumstances. I genuinely want to help them to get a better life by raising as much money as I can (although my goal is £1,300) as well as reaching my own personal goal.

Running is not natural for me so this is a massive challenge but I will work really hard on the training through the winter so that I can reach this goal. Please think of me and others who will be running 10 miles plus up to 4 times a week in the horrible cold and wet weather to make it past that finish line. So if you/your organisation could help me raise the money for my Charity (see the sponsorship letter from the Shaw Trust attached) I would really really appreciate it. I have a number of plans to hold fundraising events such as an auction and also a raffle where you buy a number between 1-100 for £5, if you are the lucky winner you get the prize and the money raised goes to the charity.

If you can, this will mean that every footstep I take will mean something to YOU and motivate ME knowing that we are all running together and achieving a positive impact for a better future for OUR children and young people. - **DO NOT** park either on the **yellow zig-zags** or across the road from the zig zags during the busy drop-off and pick-up times.

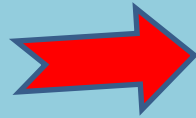
