Joseph!





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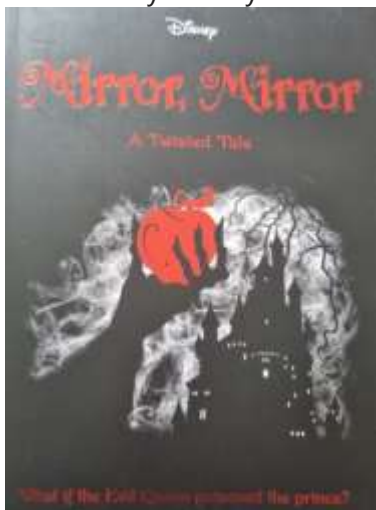
Lydia dressed up to display her reptiles. That is an interesting collection of pets!
