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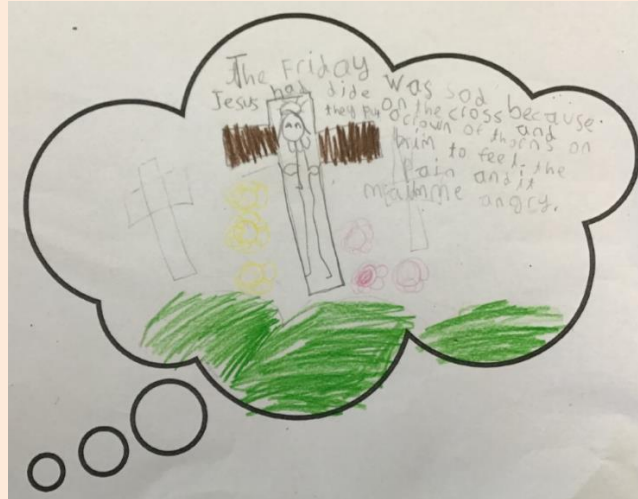

We had a great Easter Pause Day yesterday, exploring the different parts of the Easter story to gain a better understanding of them and what Easter means for us today. 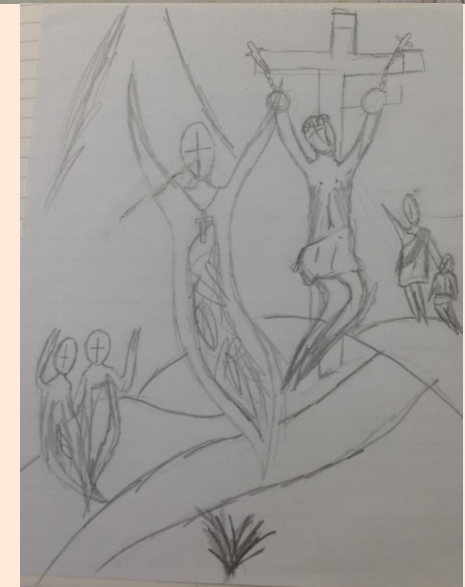
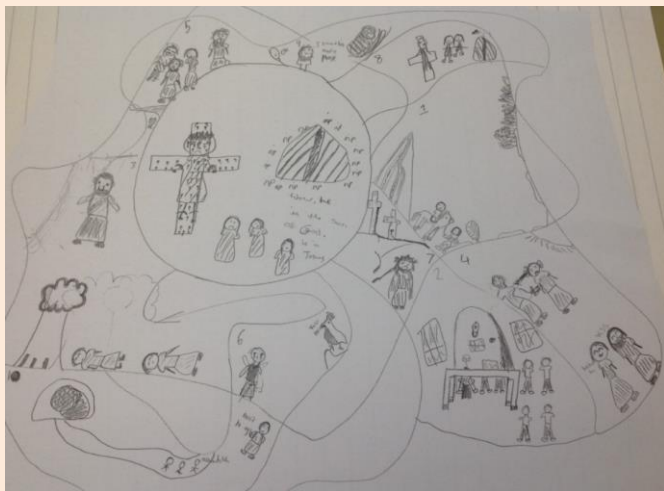

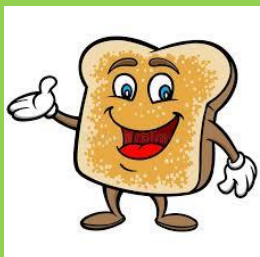


### Children in Self-isolation
