We held a silence at 11.00am. In the afternoon our two Pupil Parliament children from Year 6 joined with the other schools in our Clayton and Whittle cluster. They laid a beautiful wreath at the Whittle-le-Woods Memorial.

Today, we went up to see the soldier statue on the KS2 playground and placed the wreath over the soldier, then laid our poppy crosses around the soldier.
