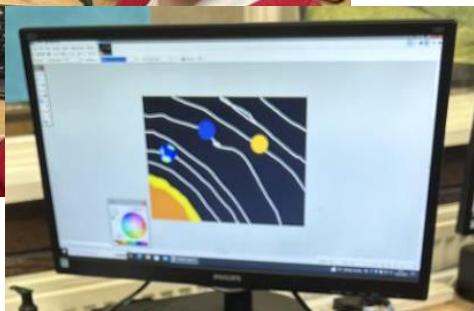
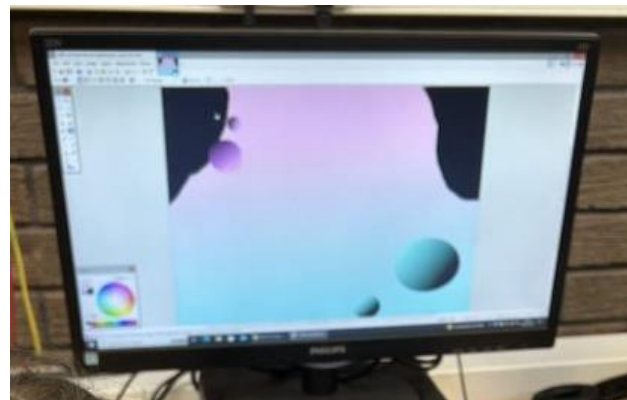
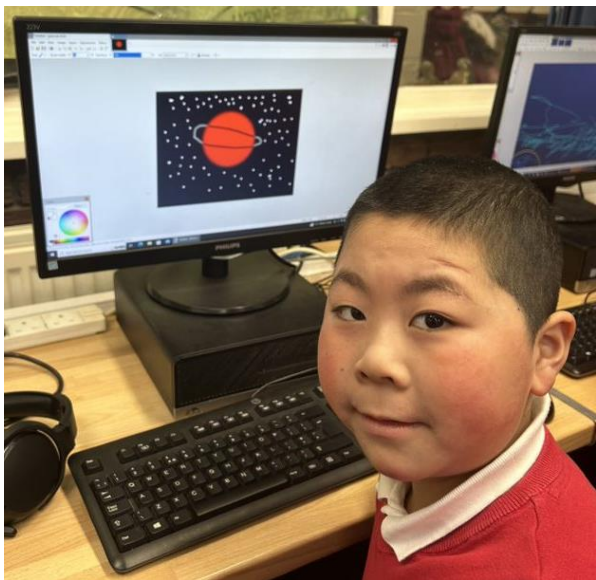


Artists in Silver Birch (Y4)
