BRITISH SCIENCE WEEK 2023

On Wednesday this week, all classes completed a science activity, based on the British Science Week theme, Connections. Please see what each class did below!

Pre-School

We looked at broccoli to introduce children to the field to fork journey – highlighting the key stages of growing, harvesting, shopping, preparing, cooking and eating. We learnt about the connection between how foods grow and how they end up on their dinner plate, and in groups had a go at ordering these key stages.





Year 1

We looked at the penguin life cycle and discovered that penguins make nests for their eggs. We then looked at the best materials to use it and thought about how best to protect eggs from the rain and wind. We tried using chopsticks to replicate a penguin's beak and found it very difficult. Then we tried again using our hands and knowledge of drainage and durability from our first try.



Reception

We also looked at broccoli and tasted some, before finding out how it is grown, harvested and prepared to be sold. We created booklets of the field to fork journey, cutting out photographs and ordering them.





Year 2

We watched a video on farm to fork 'crunchy carrots'. We talked about the process that vegetables go through from farmer's fields to our plates. The children drew a storyboard of their vegetable's field to fork journey.



Year 3

We looked at nature connections and how the loss of one connection can have a huge impact on many other plants and animals.



Year 4

Y4 were challenged to make a bridge from natural materials that would hold Mrs Bradshaw's weight!

Year 5

We completed a challenge of building a model bridge that supports heavy weights using our knowledge of the connections between weights, forces and measures.

To do this, we used only A4 paper and tape for the bridge itself, it was our job to work as a team to decide how we could make it as structurally strong as possible.

From this experiment, we discovered the connections between the weights being pulled down by gravity and the importance of the strength and structure of the paper. It had to be structurally sound with equally distributed weights for this experiment to be successful. The winning group's bridge was able to hold 3.36kg!!

We have been incredibly fortunate in the last few weeks to take delivery of a fantastic resource donated by the Bowland Charitable Trust. 34 tablet devices, preloaded with the excellent assessment tool Learning by Questions - LbQ - are all set up and being used by Year 5 and 6 to support and assess their learning in different areas including grammar, maths and history before being rolled out to other classes. This fantastic opportunity has only been made possible by the support of one of our parents, and governor, Darryl Keane. He has helped us get the most out of the devices as well as ensuring we received them in the first place!





Year 6

The children have been researching what happens to the body during exercise and using this information to create information posters.


